#### **ONGOING CALL PROCESS**

The call process is a lengthy one. Synodical safeguards that have been put into place to allow a congregation such as ours to grieve the loss of a long-term pastor require time. On top of the loss of Pastor Cordes, we have the heartbreak of Pastor Jennifer's condition that also brings us grief.

Most of you are aware that our joint call committee - 4 members from each or our two congregations, Faith Lutheran Troy (FLC), and Evangelical Lutheran Poestenkill (ELCP) - interviewed our initial pastoral candidate but did not feel that the candidate was a good match for our congregations. There was disappointment all around that this was the outcome, as we expectantly await a new spiritual leader to guide and shepherd us into the future.

The councils of both churches passed identical resolutions at their April meetings requesting a conference with the Bishop to discuss the availability of another candidate. Since the Bishop was not available for several weeks, we were referred to the Assistant Bishop responsible for Candidacy and Mobility.

The Assistant Bishop is located in the Rochester area and I discussed our concerns with her in a long telephone conversation. The thing that did impress me favorably was how much she knew about what the two congregations are going through. She was fully aware of the time frames involved, the sad fates of our Pastor and Intentional Interim Pastor, and the succession of transitional leaders who have shepherded us.

There is a potential candidate who is thinking about whether he/she is interested in being considered. The Bishop, the Assistant Bishop and our local Dean had discussed this candidate earlier in the week all felt that he/she would be a good match for our congregations. It is the Assistant Bishop's gut feeling that the candidate will want to proceed with next steps but would not speculate as

#### **OUR FAITH at WORK**

Our featured mission for the month of June will be in support of the Bread of Life Food Pantry.

Bread of Life Food Pantry is located next to Evangelical Lutheran Church in Poestenskill. It is a nonprofit organization helping families supplement their food needs. Our church has been supporting the food pantry with food donations left in the collection box in the Narthex. Every other month a list of most needed items is supplied to us and has been listed in our newsletter and on the donation box. Food items that the pantry would be most appreciative this month are: mac & cheese, canned fruit, sugar (box or bag), mustard & ketchup, chili & hash, soup & stew. Nonfood items: laundry soap, dish soap, toilet paper, paper towels, tissues, toothbrushes, deodorant. The box is filling up but there will always room for your items.

The "Pull Tab" ministry has been receiving lots of pull tab donations. We are almost at our goal of sending multiple containers of pull tabs to Synod in June. One container is full and a five gallon pail is three quarters of the way.

The pill bottle project, Matthew 25, is going well. The container set aside to receive the bottles has been filling up each week. The most stated complaint heard is how hard it is to remove the labels and glue. Your perseverance in this effort is most appreciated. We'll soon have enough bottles for our first shipment to the Matthew 25 warehouse in Cincinnati, Ohio.

The fabric kit collection for Lutheran World Service concluded in the beginning of May. Eleven kits containing three yards of fabric, two spools of thread, fifteen sewing needles and ten matching buttons were delivered to Lutheran World Service truck in Clifton Park. In addition, to the fabric kits two guilts constructed at the guilt workshops by the ladies of our congregations were also delivered In honor of our school age children this month an additional mission is being added. "Box Tops for Education" will be collected to help our area schools purchase the things they might need but are not included in the school budgets. Box Tops for Education created in 1996 by General Mills has help support education and benefit schools. Since its inception the program has expanded beyond just General Mills products but has maintained the beginning goal. Today schools have received needed computers, playground equipment, books and so much more. Watch for the "Box Top for Education" container. It will be in the Narthex on the table right next to the containers receiving donations of pull tabs and medicine bottles.
