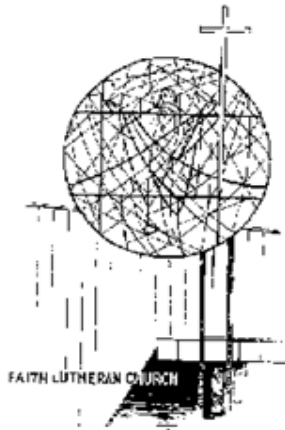

People of Faith and Evangelical,

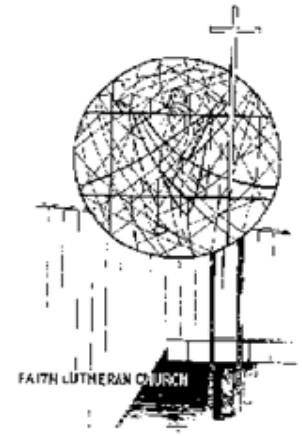
I will take the opportunity this newsletter mailing allows to introduce myself to you. Pastor Jennifer is no longer able to serve as your Transitional Pastor due to the medical treatments she will be receiving, so I have been asked to take over that position in service to the two congregations.

Presently, I am called to serve the congregations of St. Luke's in Valatie and Emanuel in Stuyvesant Falls on a half time basis. I am also the supervisory pastor for the congregation of Emanuel/St. John's in Hudson. But at the end of June, all that will be completed in my full retirement from called pastoral ministry.

What that means for you is that through the month of June I will make sure that there is worship leadership for both Evangelical and Faith, I will attend council meetings to provide pastoral support and guidance, I will perform pastoral acts such as weddings and funerals as needed, I will visit the sick, hospitalized and shut-ins, and respond to pastoral emergencies. After June, I will be available to lead you in worship and meet more of you in person.

I have served in linked parish congregations for my entire ministry: seven and a half years at St. Paul's in Redwood and Evangelical in Orleans Four Corners, NY, and now for 31 years at Valatie and Stuyvesant Falls. My wife, Christa, and I have been married for 43 years. We have two daughters, Rebekah Stephenson who lives with her son, Slater, in Las Vegas, Nevada, and Deborah Diamante who lives with her husband, Peter, and two children, Gabriel and Abigail, in Beacon Falls, Connecticut.

At the end of June, my wife and I will be moving to Fox Hill Campground in Spencertown, NY. I will be available to serve Evangelical and Faith until you call your own pastor or through the month of September, whichever comes first. PASTORAL DISCERNMENT TEAM STATUS

The Faith Lutheran Pastoral Discernment Team has met three times to date.

The first meeting was convened by Pastor Jennifer in early April to provide an orientation and a plan of work for team members.

On May 8th, a joint meeting with the Evangelical Lutheran Church Pastoral Discernment Team, facilitated by Shannon Vance-O'Campo from the Albany Presbytery, was held to begin work on drafting individual Pastor Portraits. These portraits are a description of the "needs" and "wants" of both Churches related to the future pastor in terms of the tasks and functions they will perform, experience, characteristics, or skills that are desired. The draft Pastor Portrait for Faith Lutheran will be shared with the Council, refined with input, then shared with the congregation and refined again.

The teams were asked individually to respond to a series of questions: What brings the Congregation joy? What are the Internal/ External Needs? What makes God cry? In addition, the Teams jointly listed pastoral qualities they felt were important.

SPECIAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING

The Council and the Pastoral Discernment Committee (PDC) are holding a special Informational Meeting for the Congregation at 9:30 AM, June 4, 2017, in Fellowship Hall to discuss our direction and progress to date. We hope that it will also be taken as an opportunity for members of the congregation to provide their input to the process. After another round of meetings between Evangelical, Faith, the PDC and the Council a second meeting with the congregation will take place toward the end of June. At that point, we will be looking for approval of the direction that is being recommended for our congregation and our broader Parish, Faith and Evangelical together. Our hope is that then in July, we will be able to complete the documents needed to initiate the formal call process.

AMONG OUR PEOPLE

Mildred LaLanne joined God's angels on May 15th. Pastor Bill Hempel continues his chemotherapy treatments. Dave Cerrone is continuing his recovery process with a second round of treatments and Janet Walsh is recovering from Knee Replacement Surgery.

Pastor Jennifer is glad that she can use Dana Farber, and to have reached the end of the testing and biopsy phase. It has been firmly established through biopsy; that the cancer, affecting her liver is in fact a metastasis of her breast cancer. She will

be traveling to Dana Farber in Boston each week for the next 6-9 months to receive the selected course of treatment. She did have her first chemo treatment this past Thursday. She is very grateful for the outpouring of prayers and encouragement. She and Kirk are planning to do a CaringBridge page, but it is not set up yet. Once it has been set up, interested people will be able to follow her progress there. We will also keep you updated through the newsletter each month.

COUNCIL SUMMARY

Pastor Slater and Ruth Frazee, Council President of Evangelical, were visitors attending the May Council meeting. Several items of concern to both congregations were discussed, including the acceptance of a motion of a resolution to modify the employee status of Intentional Interim Pastor Jennifer Wegter-McNelly.

A motion to accept the resolution approving Pastor Slater's engagement by the congregations was made and accepted by the Council.
