

Running the Race

Years ago I had the occasion to officiate the marriage of a couple who both worked in the horse racing business. He was a jockey and she rode the **lead pony** (the horse assisting racers to the starting gate.)

After hearing all about the couple's vocational roles, I used for their wedding text, **1 Corinthians 9:24**, "Run that you may obtain the prize."

Some points to consider for those starting out are.

1. Some races are bigger than others, but a new race is run every day. Remember that you'll get another shot at it tomorrow. Let today's troubles be enough for today. And don't rest on your laurels too long because sooner or later you'll be back in the running.
2. We all have to run our own races. However, it never hurts to have a good **lead pony** who can coax us into the starting gate. We can't run the race if we can't find the starting line. Encouragement is especially helpful, particularly when the clock is counting down. All of us can use and be good lead ponies.
3. Once in the thick of a race, things can happen that are out of our control. One can get boxed in, pushed and shoved, run out of steam. Learn to accept things that are

grown older I realize that there is also application for those of us coming down the back stretch. Keep your eye on the goal. Remember *Who* has finished the race before us. Be mindful of the cloud of witnesses cheering us along our way. And finally remember... the Finish Line has now become the new Beginning Line. For surely Isaiah's image will come to fruition, "For they will run and not grow weary." Running for the sheer joy of running? Sounds like something worth running for!
