Your Ticket Please?

The story is told about Albert Einstein, the brilliant physicist of Princeton University in the early 20th century. Einstein was traveling from Princeton on a train, and when the conductor came down the aisle to punch the passengers' tickets, Einstein couldn't find his. He looked in his vest pocket, he looked in his pants pocket, he looked in his briefcase, but there was no ticket. The conductor was gracious; "Not to worry, Dr. Einstein, I know who you are, we all know who you are, and I'm sure you bought a ticket."

As the conductor moved down the aisle, he looked back and noticed Einstein on his hands and knees, searching under the seat for his ticket. The conductor returned to Einstein; "Dr. Einstein, Dr. Einstein, don't worry. I know who you are. You don't need a ticket, I'm sure you bought one." Einstein arose and said "Young man, I too know who I am; what I don't know is where I am going."

This little story could serve well as a parable at this time of graduation. We think we know who we are, but do we know where we are going? Where shall we live? For whom shall we work? Who will we share life with? For what shall I be known? Those questions seem to never end throughout all of life. Yet, as long as we know Whose we are, we'll know where we are going. The stops along the way will become obvious enough, since indeed we are defined by our final destination, the resurrection.

I'm reminded of a chapter from Stephen Covey's book, Seven Habits of Highly Effective People, "Begin with the End in Mind". The better we perceive where all is going, the better our attitude and motivation for life. Christians call that faith, and faith will make a world of difference in how we get to where we are going. Enjoy the ride! No ticket necessary. Jesus took care of it. He knows who you are and he promises to get you home.

COUNCIL SUMMARY

Registration for the 2012 Synod Assembly on June 8th - 9th has begun. The Council is requesting Donna Van Zandt and Dave Truland serve as delegates for Faith this year.

Research and analysis continues on financial options for the remaining annex mortgage balance. The current mortgage will mature in 2014 with a final balloon payment due at that time. HSBC Bank was consulted regarding questions on how to pay more now in order to reduce the final balloon payment. The bank also indicated that a letter on options for refinancing the balloon payment will be sent 2-3 months before the final payment becomes due.

The process for developing a new church website with services provided by Connected Word is underway. 70 website templates were reviewed and have been narrowed down to a few choices. The final template will be determined shortly.

The 2nd reading of a new Continuing Resolution for Church Historian was reviewed, discussed, and approved by the Council.
